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Blasting Youth into Scouting – Ignite the FUN!

The "Blast into Scouting" campaign is aimed at introducing families to the BSA's positive and funfocused program called Cub Scouts, which is open to boys in first through fifth grade. In Cub Scouts, boys learn leadership and life skills while participating in adventures ranging from building pinewood derby cars and assembling robots to enjoying the great outdoors and helping others through its strong focus on community service.

"We know that our young people have a variety of extracurricular activities to choose from," said Greg Dunn, Vice President of Membership for Michigan Crossroads Council. "While these activities, such as athletics, each address a specific area of a child's development, Scouting provides programming that focuses on the total child.

We offer age-appropriate activities at every level so that by the time a Scout leaves high school, they are prepared to lead and succeed."

Now in its second century of serving youth and families, the BSA is building off its first hundred years by incorporating more science, engineering, technology and math-based programs to reach even more



young people. Presenting new members with eight stations of STEM related activities like using codes and cryptography and learning about the different atmospheres in each of the planets by exploring volumes. Participants will also join in on the FUN experiments to determine their own lung volume and activities that will go beyond basic archery skills to learn the "SCIENCE" behind each nock of the arrow.

Thousands of BSA volunteers will be in local elementary schools from September -October to answer questions, register new members and to invite new members to the Blast into Scouting events on October 8th. It costs \$25 annually to join Scouting but all boys can become Scouts regardless of a family's ability to pay.
