

Our Third Annual Dodge for Detroit was an enormous success raising almost \$50,000 to support our inner city youth Scouting programs! We had 48 teams compete in the round robin style tournament in the heart of Downtown Detroit. Over 400 attendees enjoyed this fun and active spin on happy hour. Since its inception, the event has raised over \$100,000 for Scoutreach programs in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties.

Kyle S. is a Bear Cub in Pack 21 at Detroit Merit School. With his mom's encouragement, he joined the Pack last school year while in 2nd grade. "Kyle was an extremely shy young man. He spoke softly. He didn't have very many friends at school. And he didn't talk very much," said his mom. In fact, Cubmaster, Carl Mitchell observed that when Kyle first joined the Pack he would often isolate himself from other boys. And he didn't participate when the boys were doing group activities. "I would always encourage Kyle to talk to the other boys. I would invite him to lead the Oath and Law at the beginning of our meetings. By the end of the year, Kyle was the leader of the Pack! Not only did Kyle ask to lead the Oath and Law at meetings but he'd be the first boy to raise his hand whenever a volunteer was needed." Kyle's mom agreed with Mr. Mitchell. She said, "By May I had a different kid. He was talking and laughing with his friends. At home, he was taking on extra responsibility by cutting the grass and doing things that I typically had to tell him to do around the house. I really believe that Kyle's new found confidence was because of his time in Scouting. Scouting empowered Kyle to believe in himself!"

Lavell K. is a Cub Scout in Pack 1318 at Nolan Elementary School, part of our Scoutreach program in Detroit. During one recent Cub Scout meeting Lavell's mom surprised the Pack by bringing in a cake to celebrate Lavell's birthday. She shared with the Pack leader that for about 3 months last winter her and her children had been homeless. "When you are homeless you just feel different than everyone else. Cub Scouts was the one thing that made Lavell feel normal. I am really appreciative that this program is available at my son's school"
