

## **Cub Scout Camping Promotion**

Time may range from 5-15 min

Thanks for volunteering to help with Cub Camp Promotions!

First and foremost, your presentation needs to be exciting and full of energy. We want to bring out the best we have in each camp. We want to tell everybody about the best camping programs in Michigan. Make sure to contact the Pack beforehand to confirm time and location.

### **So what to talk about? Below are a few things that should be done during the presentation.**

- Pass out any handouts you have (Placemat, Cub/ Web resident flyer, Family Camp flyer, FAQs)
- Know if the pack has been to camp before and which one that way you can individualize the presentation.
- Tell everybody your name and why you are there.
  - I.e. Hi my name is Dianna Marsh and I am here to tell you about the most exciting thing you can do this year, Cub Scout Summer Camp!
- If you have a camp video play it
- Mention there are 3 types of camps that they can go to, Day Camp, Family Camp and Resident Camp

#### **1. Day Camp – for those Scouts new to the program or Tiger Scouts**

- Day Camps can range anywhere from 2-5 days, Monday -Friday (depending on your location you can mention the day camps that are in close proximity to where you are doing the presentation)
- Most of them are during the normal work day hours. The exception is twilight camp which may run from around 3-7pm.
- Is a DAY program only (scouts are dropped off and picked up at location each day)
- Scouts must come with adult supervision (please check with your Day Camp Advisor for more specifics on what is required for adult participation)
- Activities include but not limited to games, nature, sports, archery, crafts, BBs, and wrist rockets/sling shots.

## **2. Cub/Webelos Resident Camp – For Wolf-Arrow of Light Scouts**

- a. Cub Resident Camp is programmed for Wolf and Bear Advancement
  - Cub Resident Camp is a 2-night overnight experience
- b. Webelos Resident Camp is programmed for Webelos 1 and Arrow of Light Advancement
  - Webelos Resident is a 3-night overnight experience
- c. Resident camp offers Scouts a chance to enjoy a full camping experience while working on advancements by having fun
- d. All program, meals and lodging are included
  - Lodging can either be in cabins or tents, all which are provided for you
- e. Activities include but not limited to aquatics (swimming boating), nature, scout skills, team building, shooting sports (BBs, archery, wrist rockets) and STEM
- f. There are showers and flush toilets located at all camp properties
- g. A trained medical officer is on staff 24/7
- h. All camps have a trading post to buy your camp memorabilia, including your very own refillable camp slushie cup

Learn new skills, make new friends, spend quality time with parents and leaders, HAVE FUN!

## **3. Family Camp**

- a. Family Camps are for the whole family (no dogs please)
- b. Perfect for new campers or families that want to know more about a specific camp
- c. Lodging is not provided but food and program are
- d. They are usually a weekend event that happens at our MI camps
- e. Very laid-back schedule
- f. They are scheduled throughout the year. Please take a look at the handout for dates and locations

All camps are run by Nationally trained and certified staff leaders.

**Notes:**

-If asked Day camps run around \$25/ day unless it is a specialty camp. Cub Resident Camp is \$120 per person, Webelos Resident Camp is \$150 per person. Family camps will vary depending on duration.

-All adults will need a Central Registry Clearance Form and YPT to go to camp

-All youth and adults will need a Health and Medical Record parts A&B

-If the Pack is signing up as a "den or pack" and providing adult leadership all adults must be registered with the BSA. I.E. 2 adults and 5 scouts. If a parent signs up separately with their scout the parent does not need to be registered. I.E. just parent and child

-Use the FAQ sheet for reference if needed
