



STEM Day Camp – Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. Where is the camp located?**
 - a. Camp Teetonkah is located at 3710 Burkhart Rd Jackson, MI 49201 (Map Here)
- 2. What are the camp hours?**
 - a. Camp Teetonkah will be open for Day Camp Monday through Friday July 15 – 19, 2019, for arrivals at 8:30 am and pick up at 4:30 pm. Early Arrival / Late Pick up available.
- 3. What does my child need to bring with them to camp?**
 - a. See the 'What to bring to STEM Day Camp' – on page two
- 4. Do you separate children by age and grade?**
 - a. Day Camp is planned to accommodate campers entering 3rd – 6th grade and they will be provided program that is applicable for their age/grade learning levels.
- 5. How do I register for a Summer Exploration Camp?**
 - a. Online Registration is available – Day Camp is SESSION 4 ONLY.
- 6. Do you offer discounts?**
 - a. Families with more than two children enrolling the same week are eligible for the family discount – please let us know when you register and we'll apply the discount for you.
- 7. Do you accept “walk up” registrations?**
 - a. I'm sorry, all session registrations are due by June 15, 2019, so that we are sure to be prepared with supplies and staff.
- 8. Will I receive additional information about camp after I register?**
 - a. Yes! We will email you to make certain you have all your questions answered. We will also email you the week prior to enrolled sessions to remind you of first day items to bring. You may contact us anytime by email [HERE](#).
- 9. Do I need to complete any health forms for my child to participate?**
 - a. Yes, the required Health Form is in the Parent Guide that you will receive by email after you register. It may also be found on our website, [HERE](#). Health forms must be mailed to us no later than July 1, 2019 for Day Camp, and if there are food restrictions or any special dietary needs we should be aware of, we ask that you complete the online dietary needs form found on our website. We will also email you a link.
- 10. Will there be any swimming or water activities?**
 - a. We will not be putting campers IN the water, no. We do have a Water Study Program, but it is done from the safety of the water's edge. The lake is very shallow and does not provide excellent swimming opportunity. We will have 'water days' where your child will/may get wet – but we will give you a couple days' notice. Water Days involve water rockets, water balloons, and similar - not lakefront activities.
- 11. What is the counselor to camper ratio at STEM Summer Camp?**

- a. Each age group will have two Counselors assigned to them for the duration of the week. This is a 1:10 Counselor to Camper ratio. Also, each program area is staffed by adult educators 21 yrs. and older, in addition to the Camp Program Director and Camp Director.

12. How do you handle inclement weather?

- a. We can run a full day's program rain or shine! Rainy days will mean more indoor FUN, but will not disappoint – we promise!

13. What precautions do you take to handle the summer heat?

- a. Lots of fresh water refills in each camper's water bottle, frequent shade breaks when we're outdoors, and every building has air conditioning – if we need it.

14. Can Camp Teetonkah accommodate children with peanut or life-threatening allergies?

- a. We strive to provide a safe and healthy environment for ALL Campers, but if your child has a peanut or life-threatening allergy, please let us know and we will determine on a case by case basis if we can guarantee the accommodations needed.

15. Will you have a wait list if your sessions fill up?

- a. Yes, and we will fill any vacancies right up until one week prior to Day Camp on 7/15/19.

16. Is there a cancellation policy, and does it allow refunds if we can't keep our reserved spot?

- a. Yes, the Cancellation policy is on the registration site, and we will email you the policy as well.

17. Does my child have to be a member of the Boy Scouts of America to attend STEM Day Camp?

- a. No. Our Summer STEM Day Camp program is open to all youth, 3rd grade through 6th grade (Fall 2019).

18. Who can drop off and pick up my child each day?

- a. Any approved, trusted adult may be listed on your camper's pick up / drop off form – which we will email to you after you register. This will allow you to add alternate drivers, should your schedule change. We will not, however, release a camper to anyone NOT on the list – so please plan to make this information known to us prior to dropping your camper each day.
