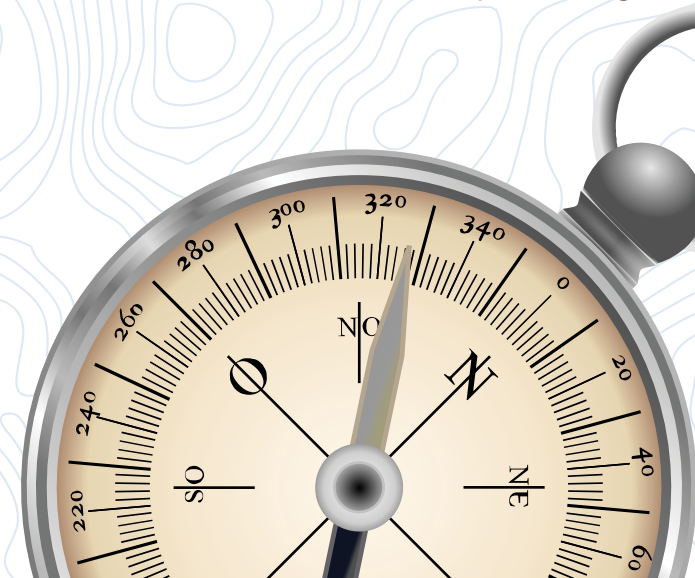

WHAT IS NYLT

Leadership training is perhaps the most important opportunity available to our Scouts and Venturers. National Youth Leadership Training is a key part of the leadership development of the BSA's youth members. NYLT is an intense, six-day experience centered on the concepts of what a leader should BE, what a leader should KNOW, and what a leader should DO.



THE IMPACT

SKILLS LEARNED

Participants learn and practice Communication, Goal Setting, Planning, Decision Making, Problem Solving, Servant Leadership, and much more.

ELIGIBLE YOUTH

Participants must possess a high level of maturity and a willingness to bring NYLT skills back home. Be a registered Scout with First Class rank, or a registered Venturer or Sea Scout. All NYLT courses are co-ed. All attendees must be age 13. Complete the Introduction to Leadership Skills (ILST/ILSC/ILSS) course for your program. Have Scoutmaster/Advisor/Skipper approval and, if under age 18, parent/guardian consent. Be comfortable living in the outdoors. A previous resident camping experience is ideal. This should not be your first time camping without your family or unit.
