




New for 2024

Aquatics

- Your access to beautiful Lake Beebe here at Camp Rotary Swimming, Boating, the Iceberg, and more!!!
- Merit badges include Swimming, Small Boat Sailing, Motorboating, Lifesaving, and more!
- Additional Programs include Open Swimming, Open Boating, the Aquatics Ninja Warrior, the Canopstacle Course, the Polar Bear Plunge, and the return of the Scoutmaster Cannonball Competition

Nature

- Our Nature Center houses various studies of the wildlife that makes up our beautiful camp!
- New merit badge experiences include Pulp and Paper, Insect Study
- Additional Programs include Nature Trivia Night, the Ugly Bug Contest, and the Critter Crawl!

Handicraft

- The Crafts hub at Camp Rotary
- Merit badges include Leatherworking, Basketry, Chess, and more!
 - The Art and Sculpture courses will be one course over the entire week Scouts will earn both merit badges in this course
- Additional Programs include Tie Dye Night (bring your own base or purchase one from the Trading Post!), LEGO Night, and Projects Night!

CAMP PROGRAMS CON'T

- Shooting Sports
 - Archery, Rifle, and Shotgun
 - Open Shoots rounds for rifle and shotgun can be purchased at the Trading Post!
 - Merit Badge students needing to qualify will have priority during Open Shoot times
 - Page 16 of the 2024 Camp Leader's Guide for all Open Shoot times
 - Additional Programs include Top Shot, Tomahawk Throwing, the returning Robin Hood competition, and the Adult Leader Stress Reliever Shoot
- COPE/Climbing
 - A Challenging Experience full of obstacles on the ground and in the air! Our Low and High COPE courses and Climbing Tower are ready to be conquered!
 - Additional Programs include Open Climbs, Open Ziplining, and the Night Crawler
 - An additional registration and fee is needed for the Night Crawler limited to the first 15 participants
- PATH
 - This exciting program for First Year Campers gives Scouts and Leaders an overview of camp while learning skills from Scout to First Class! Leaders who participate in the program throughout the full week will have the opportunity to be certified in IOLS training
