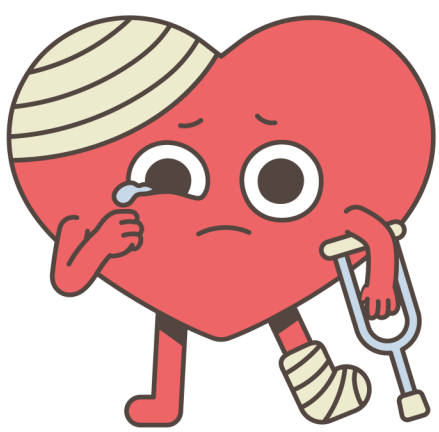


# INCIDENT REPORTING IN THE MICHIGAN CROSSROADS COUNCIL

## TYPES OF INCIDENTS

### 1 General Liability



Allegations of bodily injury, illness or property damage including employment matters.

### 2 Near Miss



Only choose this if your incident was an unplanned event that **DID NOT** result in injury, illness or damage – but had the potential to do so.

### 3 Membership Infractions



Incidents dealing with behavior that puts a Scout's safety at risk, such as YPT violations, allegations of abuse, self-harm, suicidal thoughts, bullying, etc. Or that calls into question a registered leader or youth member's continued registration with BSA.

## DID YOU KNOW?

### 1 HSR Form



Once Council submits the General Liability report to National, we will follow up with the reporter to provide a signed HSR form to the injured party. Any questions on this form need to be directed to HSR.

### 2 Helps Us Mitigate



Reporting Near Misses allows us to find trends/patterns that will allow us to potentially mitigate future risk.

### 3 Mandatory Reporter



All registered BSA Adults are **MANDATORY REPORTERS**. If you suspect, know, or are told of abuse, you **MUST** report it to CPS and the MCC.

## HOW TO REPORT

### 1 File a Report

### 2 Council Files With National



Council will submit the information to National and reply to your report letting you know this step has been completed.

### 3 Any Follow-up?



A Council representative will reach out to you and/or involved parties should the need for additional information arise in the investigation or follow-up process.
