
CAMP'S RESOUNDING IMPACT ON YOUTH

Throughout the year, Scouts are taught timeless traditions which prepare them for the modern world. While at Summer Camp, Scouts engage in activities which build foundational skills that help them thrive later in life, including the value of working hard, problem solving, networking and collaborating.

Thanks to Summer Camp, youth reported:

92% pushed themselves to try something new
89% learned the values of working together to achieve a goal
93% learned why following the rules keeps everyone safe
82% think about how they can reduce waste which impacts nature
