

Position Description

Jamboree 1st Assistant Scoutmaster

Objective: To support the Jamboree MCC Contingent Scoutmaster in leading a troop of scouts to the 2026 Jamboree and provide the best program possible, while ensuring unit, council, and National standards are maintained.

Responsible to: Jamboree Unit Scoutmaster

Tenure: Summer 2025 through fall 2026

Responsibilities:

- Support all operations within a contingent provisional Scout troop of 36 boys and 4 leaders, before and during the 2026 National Jamboree.
- Work with the Scoutmaster to ensure unit utilizes the Patrol Method.
- Serve and act as the Jamboree Scoutmaster in the absence of the official Jamboree Scoutmaster.
- Direct supervisor and advisor to Jamboree Troop Assistant Senior Patrol Leader(s).
- Promote the 2026 Jamboree to youth within your unit, district, and council.
- Plan and oversee all troop programs, activities, and campfires, with the help and input of the youth leadership.
- Coordinate buddy tags for aquatic activities.
- Assist the Jamboree Scoutmaster in planning and organizing contingent troop meetings of parents and youth at least once per month prior to the Jamboree.
- With your troop, promote and attend all council contingent Jamboree team building and shakedown campouts prior to Jamboree.
- Be an active member of the MCC Jamboree Committee including membership on a subcommittee to support the readiness of the contingent.
- · Assist the Jamboree Scoutmaster in the youth leadership selection process within your unit.
- While at the Jamboree, act as the secondary troop contact when interfacing with parents/guardians, Jamboree Staff, Commissioners, and Medical personnel.

Requirements:

- Must have a current BSA membership with a Boy Scout troop or Venture Crew.
- Be at least 21 years of age, by the first day of the Jamboree. (July 22, 2026).
- Be currently serving as a troop leader.
- Completed This is Scouting Training.
- Completed Fast Start Training.
- Completed Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout Coach Leader-Specific Training.
- Completed Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills.
- Completed Youth Protection Training within one year of the last day of the Jamboree (July 22, 2026)
- Completed Hazardous Weather Training.
- Be able to serve as a role model of physical fitness.
- Have participated in the pre-jamboree training experience.
- Have filed a Jamboree Personal Health and Medical record with the council jamboree committee before the pre-jamboree training.

• Be approved by the local council. Submit all registration fees per the local council's payment schedule.
