

Position Description

Jamboree 2nd Assistant Scoutmaster

Objective: To support the Jamboree Contingent Scoutmaster in leading a troop of scouts to the 2026 Jamboree and provide the best program possible, while ensuring unit, council, and National standards are maintained.

Responsible to: Jamboree Scoutmaster

Tenure: Summer 2025 through fall 2026

Responsibilities:

- Support all operations within a contingent provisional Scout troop of 36 scouts and 4 leaders, before and during the 2026 National Jamboree.
- Work with the Scoutmaster to ensure unit utilizes the Patrol Method.
- Direct supervisor and advisor to Jamboree Troop Quartermaster.
- Working through and with the quartermaster and patrol leaders, trains and oversees the patrols in their tasks of drawing food and food supplies, preparation and serving of food, and cleaning up. Oversees cleanup operations after each meal. Is responsible for the care and neat appearance of all equipment. Is responsible for the transportation of personal baggage to and from the Jamboree.
- Coordinate all troop physical arrangements.
- With your troop, promote and attend all council contingent Jamboree shakedown campouts prior to Jamboree.
- Be an active member of the MCC Jamboree Committee including membership on a subcommittee to support the readiness of the contingent.
- Assist the Jamboree Scoutmaster in the youth leadership selection process within your unit.
- Arranges, directly with the sub-camp, equipment, and acts maintenance officer for supplies.

Requirements:

- Must have a current BSA membership with a Boy Scout troop or Venture Crew.
- Be at least 21 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree. (July 22, 2026)
- Be currently serving in any leadership position within a Boy Scout troop or Varsity Scout team.
- Completed This is Scouting Training.
- Completed Fast Start Training.
- Completed Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout Coach Leader-Specific Training.
- Completed Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills.
- Completed Youth Protection Training within one year of the last day of the Jamboree. (July 22, 2026)
- Completed Hazardous Weather Training.
- Be able to serve as a role model of physical fitness.
- Have participated in the pre-jamboree training experience.
- Have filed a Jamboree Personal Health and Medical record with the council jamboree committee before the pre-jamboree training.
- Be approved by the local council.
- Submit all registration fees per the local council's payment schedule.
